

arry Summers has withdrawn his name for consideration as the next Federal Reserve Chairman. The stock and bond markets like that because the assumption was he would immediately and unmercifully begin the tapering program. He was considered a hawkish opponent to quantitative easing.

Tomorrow (Tuesday), however, the Fed meets and it is widely expected that they will nonetheless announce some beginning to its tapering program anyway. Up markets today may mean down markets tomorrow, depending on the news.

For this portfolio, we seek to outperform the Dow Industrials using proprietary timing and weighting formulas of the underlying thirty stocks of the Dow Industrials. We also will use the ETF that tracks the same. The symbol is DIA.

We monitor the underlying individual stocks for buys and sells in order to overweight the portfolio to what is expected to outperform and underweight the portfolio with what is expected to underperform.

new highs, which would signal the bull market as intact. If they diverge, however, this would set up the potential for a top. Confirmation of which would be if the markets fell below previous support levels. Both levels are drawn on the chart on page 1. The key upper levels to watch are the most recent horizontal lines drawn from the previous tops. The key lower levels are drawn as upwardly sloping lines.

On a fundamental basis, the economy continues to chug

along. Whether it is time or not to begin the tapering program, it did at least provide liquidity to help the recovery process. That, along with a few tax law changes like the banks not having to mark assets to depressed valuation levels.


At the same time, earnings for the S&P 500 companies as a whole have peaked and rolled over. The market, however, continued to rally, which means the market's PE ratio has increased. It is clearly not as cheap as it was at one time.

Rising interest rates may not immediately be bearish for the economy, but they would certainly provide some competition for the investor dollar.

So, the next few days should be very interesting both for the short and longer term.

Analysis (reiteration)



The chart above shows that the percentage of ETFs (a basket of 35 equity ETFs) above their 35-week moving average is shrinking, even as the SPY (S&P 500 index) continues to climb. This is potentially a worrisome negative divergence.

Consider the rallies in 2006 where the SPY hit recovery highs, while the % continued to decrease. The same scenario unfolded in the summer of 2010. In both instances, the subsequent action led to a severe bear market and a sharp pullback.

So, while the "general" the SPY leads, the troops are falling behind. This bears close watching.

PORTFOLIO DESCRIPTIONS (pages 2 and 3)

Our guiding goal is to provide the most return with the least risk.

The two portfolios were started on 1/1/10 with \$100,000. Beginning in 2012 (12/31/11), the official portfolio for measuring the newsletter performance is the Stock Portfolio only.

Portfolio changes will usually be made at the close on Monday (the day this eNewsletter is posted), or if a position is stopped out, the close that day, unless otherwise noted.

Portfolios are updated through the preceding Friday's close.

Stock dividends are paid in cash. Interest is assumed to be zero for the money market (cash) position. Commission costs to buy and sell are assumed to be \$10.00 per trade.

The S&P 500 TR (total return) includes dividend reinvestment.

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
